

## ROXBY CUM RISBY PARISH COUNCIL

### DRAFT MINUTES OF ANNUAL PARISH MEETING HELD ON 20 APRIL 2016 AT 7.15 PM IN THE METHODIST SCHOOLROOM

#### PRESENT

The Chairman opened the meeting and welcomed the members of the public. The Councillors and clerk introduced themselves.

#### 1. TO RESOLVE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING

#### 2. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

#### 3. MATTERS ARISING NOT COVERED BY AGENDA

- i) Quick Line had held an open day in the village to inform residents of the new fast broadband service they were offering. Their planning application to erect a mast at Risby had been approved.
- ii) The old carpenter shop still hadn't been repaired.

#### 4. LANDFILL SITE

There had been a few smells lately but nothing chronic. TJ had attended the Liaison meeting held 13 April 2016 and reported the Biffa contract with North Lincs Council to supply inert waste had been extended to end of August 2016. It was reported that in future the waste would be transported by rail instead of road, which would be better because 1 trainload of waste equated to 20 lorry loads of waste.

The landfill site didn't affect Dragonby. However, the Dragonby resident believed that the old quarry near Dragonby was to be used as landfill in the near future. The Chairman confirmed that there had not been any planning applications submitted in respect of this.

The new permissive footpath should be officially opened at the end of August after the farmer whose field it crosses has finished harvesting.

#### 6. DOGFOULING

It was still a problem in Roxby which was not improving. At the March Parish Council meeting it had been proposed to post slips through letterboxes asking residents to report any incidences. The Dragonby resident said it wasn't a problem in Dragonby.

#### 7. PARKING ON GRASS VERGES

This had been a problem with a few residents, one resident in particular had been regularly parking on the grass verge outside his house. However, the situation had improved and he was now mostly parking on the road.

**8. VILLAGE IMAGE**

- i) The Chairman was pleased to report that a gardener had been found to look after the planters near the village signs in Roxby. TJ would go ahead and purchase the planters to go under the signs.
- ii) The Chairman explained to the Dragonby resident that he and Cllr Holly Mumby-Croft had been to a meeting with Tim Allen, Environment Manager, North Lincs Council and new signage for Dragonby had been discussed. He suggested that the Dragonby resident contact Tim Allen to ask about progress of the signage.

**9. OPEN FORUM**

The Chairman read out a letter from Mr K Ashton, a Dragonby resident, which highlighted issues such as poor street lighting, lack of street cleaning and long delays in road repairs. The Moneyfield footpath near the bus stop was a big problem. The Chairman pointed out that the issues raised did not come under the Parish Council's jurisdiction, however he would forward the letter to Councillor Ivan Glover, Ward Councillor for Dragonby to look into these matters. The clerk would write to Mr Ashton to let him know what was happening.

The Dragonby resident reported that bikers were a constant problem in Dragonby especially at weekends. The Chairman suggested the resident write to Tim Allen.

Discussion took place about the wind turbine money allocated to Dragonby. This was being used to insulate the houses in Dragonby but Tim Allen had intimated there would be sufficient funds for other projects such as tarmacking the footpaths.
